Anthony continues his passion for music through his work as the Director of Student Leadership for the Spirit of the Old Gold and Black, Wake Forest University's Athletic Band Program and membership on the Piedmont Wind Symphony Board.

Megan M. Tang grew up in Kernersville, North Carolina. She currently works with youth as the Scholarship and Financial Aid Coordinator for Crosby Scholars of Forsyth County, an education access nonprofit serving 6th-12th grade students.
