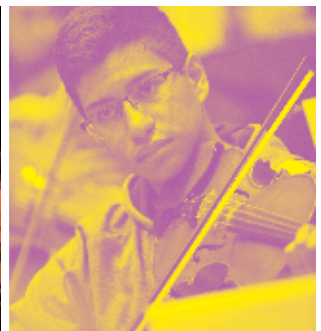

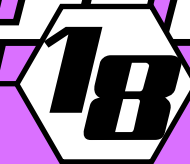

Christian Howes 2018 Artist-in-Residence, Yamaha Performing Artist Jazz violinist, educator, and producer Christian Howes brings jazz and improv to the Music for All Orchestra Division. One of the world's most respected jazz violinists, Christian studied classically from the age of five, performing as a soloist with the Columbus Symphony Orchestra at age 16 and he received his bachelor's degree in Philosophy from The Ohio State University. In 2013, he was voted among the top three violinists in *JazzTimes'* Expanded Critics Poll and ranked as the #1 "Rising Star" violinist in the *Downbeat* Critics Poll. 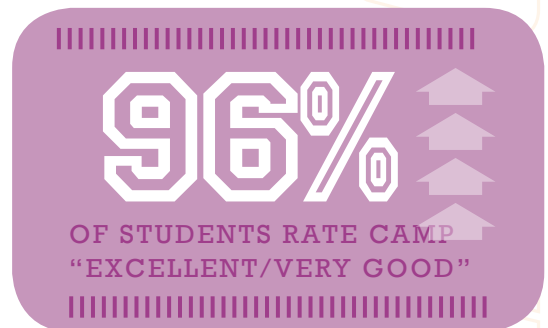
