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# PEER TEACHING PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS Students Teaching Students

The Peer Teaching Program is a dynamic lab for your student leaders. The program is designed to equip students to teach other students, their peers.

While leadership training is essential to the growth of our band programs, much of the time this training focuses on WHAT leadership is. This new division has been designed to train students to BE real leaders in their programs. Through this training, the students will be equipped with the tools necessary to inspire and train (teach) their peers. They will be trained to help with the musical and visual instruction, which will provide another level of teaching in their programs.

For programs without a large staff, these students will become the technicians to help bridge the teaching from the director to students. Student participants will learn how to effectively communicate with their peers using the same verbiage as their directors and instructors. They will be taught the basic principles of movement, and how to read and clean drill charts.

While preparing them to be secondary teachers/instructors for marching band, the students will also be trained musically to conduct effective sectionals and rehearsals which should be beneficial to the band program throughout the entire year. With this training, the students, Peer Teachers, will become a value secondary teaching asset to their directors

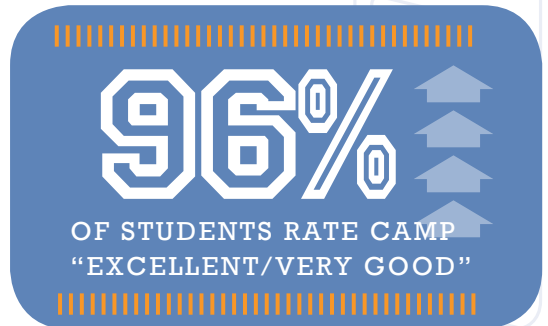
